Every year in the Commonwealth is an election year. On November 3, Virginians will have the opportunity to elect candidates for President, Congress and some "down-ballot" offices. In an era when more people worldwide are gaining the right to vote, many Americans are not exercising this right. In fact, in most elections, no more than 60 percent of eligible voters actually cast a ballot.

Faithful Citizenship reminds us to take an active part in public life through our voice and our vote. The Virginia Catholic Conference (VCC) is committed to increasing voter participation through outreach in parishes, Catholic schools and Catholic campus ministries. Students who will be 18 or older on November 3 can inspire their peers, family members and fellow parishioners to vote. Broaden students' understanding of voting and the 26th Amendment, and encourage those eligible to register to vote. Then, encourage them to post photos of their school or mascot with **#CatholicsVote** and other hashtags for their diocese/school (see handout).

What are the general requirements for registering to vote in Virginia?

- Must be a U.S. citizen
- Must be 18 on or before the next General Election. Thus, 17-year olds born on or before ٠ November 3, 2002, can register TODAY.
- Must be a resident of Virginia
