

Proposed Constitutional Amendment **Restoring Voting Rights**

Vote YES on Ballot Question 3

- ✓ It would restore voting rights to people who have completed their prison sentences.

Virginia is the **only state** in which the Governor alone decides whether to restore a person's voting rights.



Giving people a second chance to be a part of decisions that affect them, their families, and their communities affirms their dignity. It is an act of restorative justice.
